MIAMI, FL July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014 – The premier Film Series **Recent Cinema from Spain** will celebrate the diversity of contemporary Spanish movies from November 20<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> at the historic Olympia Theater at the Gusman Center in Miami. Recent Cinema from Spain 2014 will begin with a red-carpet opening night gala and VIP reception on the evening of Thursday, November 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014. Continuing through Sunday, November 23<sup>rd</sup>, ticket and pass holders have the opportunity to watch Spain's most recognized films of the year and interact with major figures from the Spanish Film Industry. Directors and actors will present their respective films and participate in question and answer sessions following the screenings. The films will be presented in Spanish with English subtitles.

This event is the most important Spanish film showcase held annually in Florida. The previous three editions attracted large audiences of approximately 4,000 each year and the Series is now an essential and respected fixture in the cultural calendar of Miami.
